

Our April 2015 Prayer Letter

Dear Pastors and Brethren,

Thank you for praying for Zhenya. He has continued to come and even showed up last Saturday when we went out for some evangelism in the market place! I've been like a dove with him but have preached the gospel here and there. He is a friend of the teens who come to church. His mother is more or less paralyzed (bedridden) and his father is not in the picture. We ask you to continue to pray for him to receive Jesus Christ as his personal Saviour.

We also have another prayer request about our upcoming registration dilemma. We have been registered with the university for two years now, but it's located in what is no longer considered (by many) to be part of Ukraine. We live about 20 miles from the university and the Donetsk rebel army was not successful in obtaining all of the Donetsk region; about two-thirds remain under Ukrainian control. We are 10 miles from the New Republic's most current boundary line (in the "old" Donetsk territory). In fact, the rebel advance stopped just miles from where we live. There were four casualties in one of our neighboring cities three miles south of us when the rebels returned fire from the Ukrainian position. The university is no longer under Ukrainian control and therefore we aren't able to receive registration with them. We are trying to get registration from another university. We may have to exit the country for a short time but won't unless it's absolutely necessary. There are a few things we could do, and we want the Lord's will. Please pray about this. Our registration is good until June 20th, so we have a little time left.

Thank you all for praying for Joanna. We finally got the results of the MRI. She has a small tumor on one of her spinous processes. They said it's not cancer but can cause pain, and they gave us medicine for the issue. I have to give her shots every day. It also showed that she has a calcification in one of her kidneys, and she will have a lengthy trial with the medicine we bought for that.

Andre had an accident again and said he understands that he made a big mistake and is now trying to get rid of his motorcycle. He won't be able to walk by himself for three months. He told me that if God lets him be okay through this then he promises to serve the Him better. We will probably go to see him this month and see Igor as well. Igor wants to help Andre while he's healing up. He also wants to get baptized and asked if I could do it. We will, Lord-willing, try to go and see them both before our registration ends.

Lastly, we have a brother who is ordering a tent and we will probably go through the same company. We, Lord-willing, will put in an order the middle of this month. Please pray about this as well...we need a good-quality tent at a reasonable price. We will look over the design in a few days, and most likely place the order.
